

## DID YOU KNOW ? ? ?

- Chartered non-public schools receive their charter from the State Board of Education and must follow the Operating Standards for Ohio's schools, as prescribed by the Board.
- Catholic schools also are accredited by the Ohio Catholic Schools Accrediting Association.
- There are 757 chartered non-public schools in Ohio educating more than 182,968 pupils.
- That 10% of all school-aged students are educated in chartered non-public schools.
- Catholic school students represent approximately 72% of all pupils attending chartered non-public schools.
- By educating more than 182,968 pupils each year, chartered non-public schools save the taxpayers of Ohio approximately 2.0 billion dollars (182,968 x 10.513, the average per pupil cost in the public schools.)
- During the current school year, \$607.22 per pupil was allocated by the state legislature to provide auxiliary services to students attending chartered non-public schools.
- The auxiliary service program includes the purchase and loan of computer hardware and related equipment.
- That state monies are expended for the benefit of students attending chartered non-public schools in the following programs: Pupil Transportation, Auxiliary Services, Mobile Unit Replacement and Repair, Administrative Cost Reimbursement, Connectivity to the Internet, Entry Year Programs for teachers and principals and post Secondary Enrollment Options.
